

Sustainability procurement policy

The Miyoshi Kasei Group collaborates with our suppliers in an effort to ensure that our raw materials meet our Quality standards and General terms and conditions, but also our CSR strategy. In conducting transactions with other parties, we require that they strictly fulfill the same commitment and engagement as we do.

This policy's aim is to describe our commitment towards sustainable procurement, and ensure that it is passed on to our suppliers.

It applies to all Miyoshi Kasei Group workers, especially those involved in procurement, in direct or indirect relationship with suppliers, implementing CSR policies or in assessing CSR compliance.

I. Risks assessment

We work toward identifying risks associated with our procurement process, on CSR related fields: economic, social, ethical and environmental. When facing the choice of a new product, new supplier, new development, or new process, these key items are analyzed in order to make the best decision in accordance to our core principles.

Our goal is to assess 80% of our supply chains by 2025

II. Suppliers engagement

We require our suppliers to have values that are directed to conducting business in full compliance with the law and with the highest ethical standards. We expect their commitment to respect our CSR principles and goals, and act towards implementing all necessary actions accordingly.

Our goal is that 80% of our suppliers, and 100% of our key suppliers in raw materials, sign our CSR Act by 2024 and 2025 respectively. We accept suppliers to present their own Code of conduct or Policy, if the requirements match with our own.

III. Suppliers' assessment

We use dedicated questionnaires to assess the quality of our suppliers in regard to their involvement in Corporate Social Responsibility: environmental impact, social involvement, ethical behavior, business practices.

In case our suppliers' strategy is not fully aligned with our requirements, they have all our support to work toward compliance.

Our goal is to evaluate 100% of our suppliers in Ingredients, Packaging and Logistics, and 80% of our suppliers of services and sub-contracting, by 2025.

Purchasing managers, quality management managers, CSR managers or any people in charge of these topics through the companies, are responsible to enforce this policy.

This policy will be reviewed every 2 years or as soon as the need arises.
